Quality/score	Criteria	
	Knowledge of the subject, thoroughness of preparation	Clarity and organization of presentation
1 - beginning	Ill-prepared, shows little understanding of the subject, confused about basic ideas	Disorganized, unclear presentation, does not convey information effectively to the audience, visual aids/written material poorly integrated into the presentation, speaker mostly reads notes
2 - developing	Obvious lack of familiarity with the subject beyond the most basic ideas, confused or uncertain about major points	Somewhat organized presentation, but logical connections among the facts presented are often unclear/uncertain, does not use visual aids/written material effectively to communicate subject, speaker relies heavily on reading notes
3 - solid	Reasonable grasp of the major ideas, some confusion or uncertainty about details or with answering questions	Reasonably organized presentation, conveys basic ideas to audience but noticeable lack of clarity in details, uses visual aids/written material somewhat effectively
4 - accomplished	Solid grasp of the subject, can give satisfactory answers to questions, shows only minor uncertainty	Generally well organized presentation, communicates main ideas and details to audience well, uses visual aids/written material effectively to convey subject
5 - outstanding	Clear mastery of the subject, can answer questions with ease and shows firm grasp of the subject beyond what is presented	Truly well-organized presentation, main ideas and details are clearly and effectively communicated to the audience, visual aids/written material are well-integrated and effectively used to advance the presentation
